Based on a review of the 2015, 2016, and 2017 STAAR results, the areas stated above are most in need of improvement for the 2017-2018 school year. SISD is focusing on gaining more knowledge of the STAAR tests and utilizing data from the previous year's testing to emphasize a more structured and aligned curriculum to meet student's needs. An importance is being placed upon the depth of student learning and expansion of the problem solving processes that correlate with the rigorous new testing standards currently in place.
